## INTRODUCTION

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) affords students the flexibility to select from a range of prescribed courses, encompassing core, elective/minor, and skill-based courses. This system permits the evaluation of these courses through a grading system, which is widely regarded as superior to the traditional marks-based system. Consequently, it is imperative to implement a uniform grading system across all higher education institutions in India. Such a system would facilitate student mobility between institutions within India initially and subsequently on a global scale. Moreover, a standardized grading system would enable potential employers to more effectively assess candidate performance. To achieve uniformity in the evaluation system and in the computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be done based on student performance in examinations, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has established comprehensive guidelines to be adhered to in this regard.

# **Examination Procedure**

- All examinations shall be strictly meticulously and transparently conducted administered in strict accordance with the resolutions passed by the Statutory Committees, namely the Board of Studies, the Academic Council and the DNR College Examinations Committee. The evaluative processes for each academic semester are bifurcated into two distinct categories: External Examinations and Internal Examinations. Semester end exams(SEE) are held after the successful completion of two Internal Examinations, specifically designated as Continuous Assessment Test-1 (CAT-1) and Continuous Assessment Test-2 (CAT-2), of the respective semester.
- Internal Examinations shall constitute 25% of the total marks allocated to the respective paper with a delineation of 15% for written examinations, 5% for co-curricular activities and 5% for extra-curricular activities. In this regard, the subject expert responsible for the concerned paper shall prepare Question Banks or three sets of question papers, which are to be subsequently submitted to the Dean of Academics. From these submissions, a single set of question papers or the requisite number of questions from the question bank

shall be randomly selected to formulate the question paper for the Internal Examinations.

- These examinations will be conducted in a free, fair and transparent manner, similar to semester-end examinations. Internal examiners will handle the valuation and preparation of answer scripts. One internal exam will be conducted offline in a descriptive format, while the other will be conducted online in a multiple-choice questions format.
- The average marks secured by a student across the two internal examinations shall be utilized for the final determination of the student's examination result.
- Semester-end Examinations, accounting for 75% of the total marks allocated to the respective paper, shall be conducted at the conclusion of the respective semester.
- The evaluation of answer scripts for all semester papers in external examinations shall be conducted exclusively by external examiners who are from other affiliated colleges or universities. Upon receipt of the evaluated answer scripts, scrutinizers will meticulously verify them, and any necessary corrections will be made by the COE/ACOE if needed.
- Practical Examinations shall be conducted either prior to or following the
  respective semester-end examinations. For odd semesters, these practical
  examinations shall be conducted by Internal Examiners, whereas for even
  semesters, they shall be conducted by a combination of one External
  Examiner and one Internal Examiner.
- The marks obtained in External Examinations, Practical Examinations, and the average marks from the two internal examinations shall be compiled, entered into the computer and subsequently processed to facilitate the declaration of students' provisional results.

 Provisional data pertaining to examination results, including the pass percentage of students in each subject or paper, shall be generated using computer software. This data shall then be presented to the Results Committee, comprising the Principal, Controller of examinations and Chairpersons of the Board of Studies / Heads of Departments.

Where Ci is the number of credits of the course and Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the course.

The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into the account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of the programme. i.e.,

$$CGPA = (Ci \times Si) / Ci$$

Where Si is the SGPA of the semester and Ci is the total number of credits in that semester. The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

### Practical exams conduction

The Practical Examinations shall be conducted soon after the Semester End Examinations. The Practical Examination board of even semester for each paper shall be comprised of one External Examiner and one Internal Examiner. In instances where external examiners are unavailable, the practical examinations shall be conducted by two Internal Examiners, whereas for odd semester internal examiners shall be appointed. External Examiners shall be appointed from the panel approved by the Board of Studies and the Academic Council and shall be provided with travel and daily allowances in accordance with established norms. Each examination board shall be supplied with a model question paper and a Scheme of Valuation for the practical examination, as approved by the Board of Studies. Upon the completion of Practical Examinations, the Examiners are required to submit the Answer Scripts, Marks

Statements, Remuneration Bills, and other relevant documents to the examination section.

#### **Evaluation**

The evaluation of answer scripts for External Examinations shall be conducted by external examiners selected from the panel approved by the Board of Studies and the Academic Council. Examiners are appointed from the staff members currently teaching the respective papers and whose names appear in the approved panel. Only lecturers with a minimum of five years of teaching experience are eligible for appointment as examiners. A period of seven to ten days is allocated for the evaluation process. After completion of the evaluation, the answer scripts shall be securely transported back and preserved under safe custody within the examination cell.

## **Revaluation Process**

Provision is made for personal verification, photocopying of answer scripts and revaluation upon payment of the prescribed fee. For revaluation, a different examiner than the one who originally assessed the paper will conduct the review. The highest mark obtained between the first and second evaluations will be considered the final mark. If the difference between these two marks exceeds 15%, the answer script will be sent for a third evaluation. Following the third evaluation, the average of the two closest higher marks from the three valuations will be considered the final mark.

The regulations relating to Admissions are governed by the AP State Council of Higher Education (APSCHE) and the Affiliating University while the regulations relating to the designing of the Curriculum, Assessment, Examination etc., will be governed by the Boards of Studies and Academic Council.

# **Eligibility Criteria For Admission**

To take admissions into any PG programme one has to qualify in the respective UG Programe. (The detailed eligibility criteria for each programme are given in Annexure-I.).

In addition to the above eligibility criteria as mentioned in Annexure-1, one has to qualify in the Post Graduate common entrance test (PGCET)in case of MA and M.Sc. Programmnes. Where as in case of MBA and MCA one has to qualify in Integrated Common Entrance Test (ICET) Examination. Both the above two examinations will be conducted by the Government of Andhra Pradesh by appointing a Convener separately for the above two examinations.

#### **Examinations Procedure**

Odd semester-end examinations (I, III) will be conducted during the months of October and November, whereas, Even semester-end examinations (II, IV) will be conducted during the months of March and April of every academic year. Practical examinations will be commenced soon after the completion of theory examinations.

Regarding assessment, out of 100 marks allotted for each course 75 marks are for semester end examination and 25 marks for continuous assessment which is made by the concerned teachers/department.

As far as semester end examination (for75marks) is concerned three sets of papers will be set by three different external paper setters out of which one set will be selected by the Chief Controller of Exams / Principal on the day of Examination.

The answer scripts will also be evaluated by the internal examiners. Regarding continuous assessment, two tests (CAT 1 and CAT 2) will be conducted and the average marks of these two tests will be considered.

Results of the semester-end examinations will be announced within 10 - 15 days after the completion of examinations. The results will be displayed on our college web site https://dnrcollege.org Students can browse their result and download the marks statement under 'Exam Results' icon on the home page.

Semester-end 'Marks cum Grades Memo' will be issued within one week after completion of the process of Revaluation. Students can collect their marks memos from the college office as and when the announcement is made to that effect.

The final year regular out going students and supplementary students who pass their two-year P.G. programme will be issued the "Provisional Degree Pass Certificate" and "Consolidated

Where Si is the SGPA of the individual semester and Ci is the total number of credits in that semester. The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

#### Practical exams conduction

The Examinations will be conducted after the Semester End Examinations. Each Practical Examination board will consist of one External Examiner and one Internal Examiner. If external examiners are unavailable, two Internal Examiners will conduct the practical examinations. External Examiners will be selected from the panel approved by the Board of Studies and the Academic Council.

#### Evaluation

The evaluation of answer scripts for External Examinations will be undertaken by external examiners chosen from a panel approved by the Board of Studies and the Academic Council. These examiners are selected from among the current teaching staff for the respective subjects and must be listed in the approved panel. Only lecturers with a minimum of five years of teaching experience will be eligible for appointment as examiners. The evaluation process is will be completed in seven to ten days. Upon completion, the answer scripts will be securely transported back and stored under strict security within the examination cell. The evaluation of internal answer scripts will be done by the respective college staff who taught the course. After the evaluation, the answer scripts will be shared with the students, followed by a discussion about their performance. Necessary suggestions and feedback will be provided based on individual needs. The marks will then be tabulated and submitted to the Head of the Department (HOD) for verification. Once verified, the HOD will submit the final marks to the examination cell.

#### **Revaluation Process**

Provisions are available for personal verification, photocopying of answer scripts and revaluation upon payment of the prescribed fee. For revaluation, a different examiner will reassess the paper to ensure impartiality. The highest mark between the initial and re-

evaluated scores will be taken as the final mark. If the discrepancy between the two evaluations exceeds 15%, the answer script will undergo a third evaluation. The final mark will then be determined by averaging the two closest higher marks from the three evaluations. This rigorous process ensures fairness and accuracy in the assessment of student performance
