1. Title of the practice: Education for all

2. Objectives of the Practice: 'Education for all' enables all citizens stand on their own feet for honorable living and makes the nation rich and strong. Education for all the selected students in the institution may not be possible for lack of money.

3. The Context: The students apply for seat in educational institutions and some students might be selected, but all those selected ones are unable to bear the burden of cost of fee, lodging and boarding and so such students, though highly merit, cannot join the institute to pursue the dream of their education. Experiencing this situation the college authorities thought of fee concessions, fee remissions, sponsors and hostels and implemented effectively to make to realize the education for all.

4. The Practice: For the poor students, who are not getting fee reimbursement for various reasons, some philanthropists are coming forward, due to initiation of the institutional authorities, as sponsors to pay the tuition fee etc. some students may able to pay a part of fee only and for such students fee concessions are given by the college. Some students are able to pay the partial fee lately and for such students remissions are given.

Thus joined non local students if they get social welfare hostel scholarship join in the college attached hostels for boys and girls separately.

The OC students who are not getting social welfare hostel scholarships have to pay from their pockets to join in the said hostels. Many students cannot afford. So, by the initiation of the Management the present Management's family established hostels for girls named Gokaraju Lyla Ganga Raju, for boys the Subba Raju Bhavan, maintained by the financial help of the said family and of some donors and of alumni. In addition to the said two hostels some more poor students are provided lunch and dinner at Dantuluri Jagannadha Raju Choultry.

5. Evidence of Success: Apart from the college attached hostels for boys and girls (based on the social welfare hostel scholarships) and the other two hostels as mentioned above (run by donations) are providing shelter and food to a large number of students joined in the institution seen physically and through records.

A large number of students are not paying anything to the institution from their pockets. As said the students are financially supported, apart from government social-welfare/welfare scholarships, by fee concessions, fee remissions by the institute and by sponsors.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required: There is no need of much requirement of resources. The financial help needed and sought from the sources other than from the government is almost timely. However, if the scholarships/reimbursements for the students from the government paid timely there would be no pell-mell of the financial management of the institution.

Some students before completion of their study drop from the college. The amount to be paid to the college if they don't drop would be a considerable amount which is lost by the college.

7. Notes: To inculcate institutional values and best practices in the college 'Education for all' will be a better tool in the process of multifaceted development of teaching-learning-evaluation and extension activities.

Response:

Before our nation's independence, D.N.R. College was established to provide rural poor with higher education. The Management has been working since then for utterly poor students and for those not receiving any government scholarship.

As a result of a lack of appropriate social welfare programs, OC categories are unable to join hostels. As a result, the college has operated two distinct hostels for boys and girls. The Subbaraju Bhavan, a lodging for young men, and the Gokaraju Lyla Gangaraju inn for young ladies are kept up with. Undergraduates of the Vysya People group are furnished with free boarding and housing in the inn and show to the nearby business local area, a piece of the executives of this school. Additionally, Dantuluri Jagannadha Raju Choultry, which is run by a few members of the Governing Body, is providing lunch and dinner to additional students.

Alluri Sitarama Raju Kshatriya Seva Samithi, tolerating the desires of the administration of DNRC, has been offering charge concessions to the monetarily in reverse Undergraduates and Assessment expense reductions to the in an unexpected way capable Undergraduates.

Thus, this institution debarred poverty of a student irrespective of caste, creed or religion to pursue studies and realize abilities.
