To make teaching more learner-centric take-home Assignments, Seminar Presentations and Projects with referencing support are given to bright learners and Remedial Teaching for slow learners. Making use of audio-visuals and Discussion, Debate and Discovery method of teaching instead of the mere pupil - pedagogic method has been the order of the day. Associating experts from user community and developing collaborations for live projects with them and Associating Alumni settled in respective disciplines as visiting fellows to foster linkages as well as ensuring hands on experiences to students have been taken up. Teachers are becoming IT savvy and preparation of lessons based on web-resources are on the increase.

Evaluating the student on the basis of periodic written tests , take-home Assignments, the potential contribution of the project for theory building and practice models, verbal articulation that is essential for discharging the responsibilities in the future work situation are in vogue in the number of courses. This is in combination with developing a commitment among the individual teachers to adopt effective teaching-learning practices and annual feedback from students on teaching-learning practices has improved the internal quality of the college system.
